

Students practice with their finger in the space provided on their page 3 times. Encourage students to say the sound that o_e makes while tracing. 4. Then students will use a pencil to trace o_e while repeating the sound it makes. 5. Ask students what does rat bring? (covered in comprehension questions). Guide students to the sentence "Rat brings his robe." 6. Students repeat the sentence then cut out the sentence building pieces and place them in correct order. Once students have checked their work, glue them down. 7. Students practice writing the sentence.
