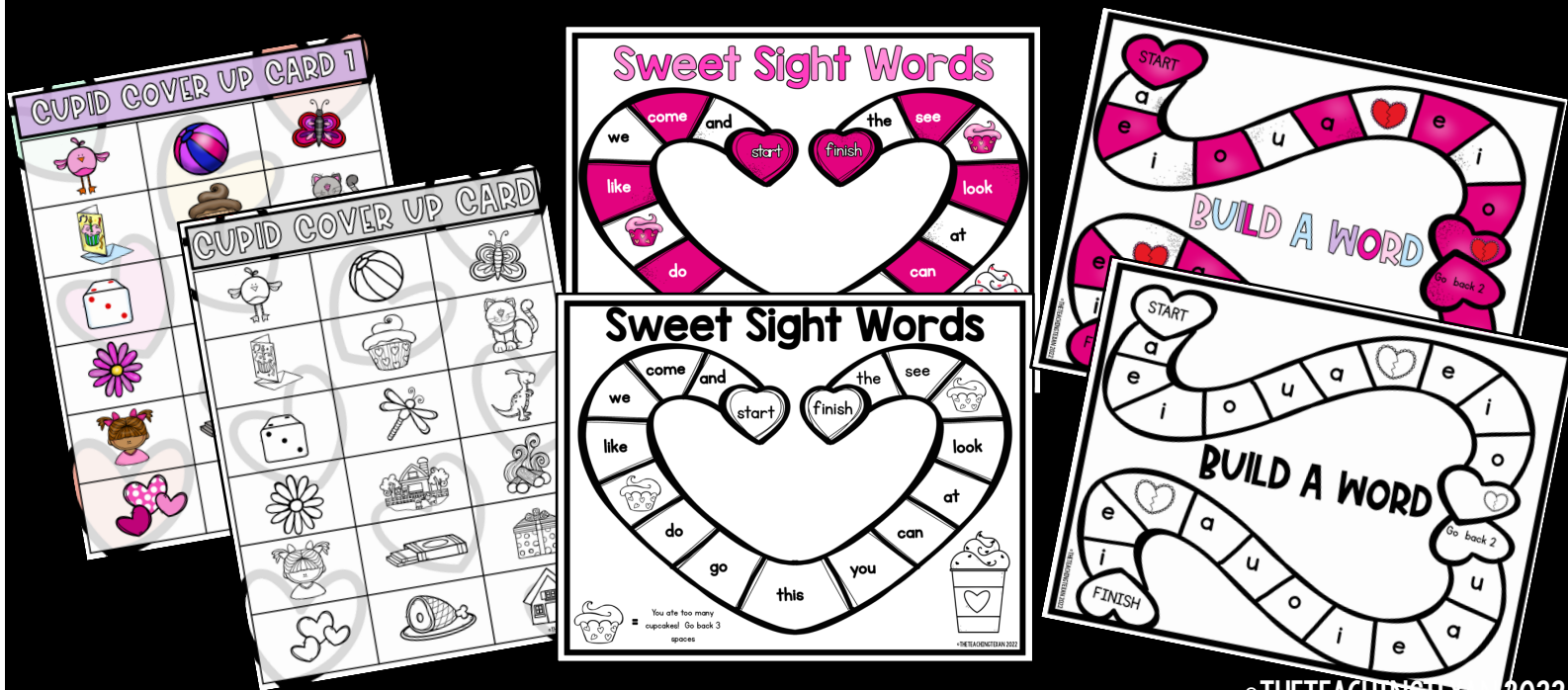

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Cupid Cover Up
-practices beginning sounds and letter-symbol knowledge

Sweet Sight Words
-practices identifying and reading sight words

-practices reading CVC words

-practices creating rhyming pairs



Build a Word
-practices building CVC words



Each game contains full page of directions for easy teacher access. These can also be displayed as children are playing.

SWEET SIGHT Words



Directions
Multi-Player Competitive
 All players begin by placing a game token or counter on the "start" space.
 Player 1 spins and moves that many spaces.
 He/she will read the sight word that they land on. Advanced players can use the word in a sentence.
 If the player cannot read the word, they must go back to where they started from.
 Turn moves on to the next player.
 If a player lands on a cupcake, they must go back three spaces because they "ate" too many cupcakes.
 The first player to reach the end of the board wins.

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CUPID COVER UP Beginning Sounds



Directions
Multi-Player Competitive
 Players will use the spinner with letters and the matching picture board to play.
 Player one will spin and say the sound that the letter makes.
 He/she will then cover up one of the pictures that starts with that sound.
 Players continue until one player has covered up all the sounds in a vertical row.
 Players can use counters to cover the pictures or the included tokens.

Alternative Option
 The same rules as above except players will play until the entire board is covered.

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BUILD A WORD



Directions
Multi-Player Collaborative
 Players/Partners will work together to build CVC words.
 Player will spin and move that many spaces on the board. If he/she lands on a broken heart or spins a broken heart they lose their turn.
 The vowel that he/she lands on will be the middle sound (medial sound) for the CVC word.
 For example, if they land on "ar" they can build "C-AR-T".
 The vowel and consonant cards should be placed face up to make word building easy.
 Players will use the word mat to build words.
 Optional: Players can write the words down on paper or their journal.

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Use mini-erasers, counters, or included games pieces for playing.
